This Instrument made this 16th day of Octo. in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine between William Prince as trustee and Nancy Waller consort of John H. Waller which said John H. Waller executed to the said William Prince for the benefit of S. & J. Dowry a deed of trust bearing date of 22nd May 1838 and of record in the Clerks office of Southampton County all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Winnifred Pettyway of the same County and State of the other part. Whereas it is that the said William Prince as trustee and Nancy Waller for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and Seventy one dollars in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Winnifred Pettyway her heirs and assigns forever One Certain tract or parcel of Land which the said John H. Waller purchased of Solomon Dyer sick Slave lying and being in the County of Southampton containing one hundred and fifty three acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit: On the North by the land of Lucy Parker on the East by the lands of the said John H. Waller and William B. Goodwyn on the South by the land of William B. Goodwyn and on the West by the land of John H. Waller with all and Singular the appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any way appertaining to have and to hold unto the said Winnifred Pettyway her heirs and assigns forever the right title and interest of the said Land and the said William Prince do convey as is vested in him as trustee and the said Nancy Waller do for herself her heirs &c warrant and forever defend by these presents against the claim of every person or persons whatsoever unto the said Winnifred Pettyway her heirs and assigns forever.
