Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the just and full sum of thirty thousand dollars to be paid unto the said Governor and his successors for the use of the Commonwealth for the payment whereof well and truly to be made we bind ourselves and each of us our and each of our heirs Executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 16th day of December 1839.

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound Thomas Postow is constituted and appointed Sheriff of the County of Southampton by a Commission from the Governor under the seal of the Commonwealth dated the 29th day of November 1839 If therefore the said Thomas Postow shall truly and faithfully collect accounts for and pay the taxes imposed by law and arrears of taxes due in the said County of Southampton and shall truly and faithfully collect accounts for and pay the militia fines imposed by law and arrears of militia fines due in the said County of Southampton then the above obligation to be void or else to remain in full force and Virtue as

This Underture made this 16th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine Between Drury Beale & Temperance his wife of Southampton County Virginia of the one part and Richard Darden of Southampton of the other part Witnesseth that the said Drury Beale & Temperance his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and twenty five dollars to them in hand paid by the said Richard Darden the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged they the said Drury Beale & Temperance his wife hath granted bargained and sold Alimute enffroy and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell Alimute enffroy and convey unto the said Richard Darden his heirs and assigns forever one certain part or parcel of land containing seventy five acres to the same more or less it being the lot of land which David Newson drew of the land of Benjamin Edwards deceased the right of his wife Lucy. Situated lying and being in the County of Southampton on the south side of Newbury River and bounded as follows Viz. Beginning at a New corner made in lot No. 1 being the lot of the children of James Edwards deceased running thence North 85 and East 210 Poles to a new corner made in the Division upon the out bounds between David Newson's lot No. 5 & George Edwards' lot No. 6 thence along the various courses of the out bounds to a spire a new corner made in John Mours' lot No. 11 then where the crop fence runs down to the branch thence North 31 West 85 poles to the 1st station. To have and to hold the said tract of land and premises and every parcel thereof and also the reversion and reversions and remainders right title interest claim and demand whatsoever of them the said Drury Beale & Temperance his wife or any other person or persons claiming under them or in and to the said premises all and singular the said land above mentioned unto the said Richard Darden for himself and his heirs the said tract of land and every part thereof Against themselves and their heirs and against all and
