This Indenture made this 5th day of July 1839 between James Lenoir and his wife Elizabeth of Fayette County Tennessee of the one part, Allen Edwards of the County of Southampton Virginia of the other part. Witnesseth that the said James Lenoir and his wife Elizabeth Lenoir for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and Seventy dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Allen Edwards his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract plantation or parcel of Land with all the appurtenances thereto belonging containing One hundred and six acres more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton Virginia and known by the name of the Bulls tract being the same land which the said James Lenoir purchased of Allen Edwards ^{said} wife Bills and Henry Bills difference being made to the State off the boundaries will more fully appear. To have and to hold the said tract of Land to the said Allen Edwards his heirs and assigns forever. And the said James Lenoir and Elizabeth Lenoir further their heirs &c do and will forever warrant and defend against the claims of all and every person or persons whatsoever.
