land formerly owned by Benjamin Hines etc. it being their interest in said tract of parcel land for
the sum of one hundred and five dollars to them in hand paid by the said Henry Pittaway the receipt
thereof is the said Elizabeth M. Woodard and Sarah B. Woodard admt' of Jeptha Woodard dec'd. doth hereby
acknowleage. To have and to hold the two above named shares or parcels of land with all and singular

& Mary his wife and Amos Joyner in consideration of the sum of Sixty dollars lawful money to them
in hand paid by the said Harrison Joyner hath burgained and sold and by these do & each of them
doth burgain and sell unto the said Harrison Joyner a certain tract of land lying in the County of
Southampton and bounded as follows Beginning at a post oak of Salt Grotto line thence bounded by Grotto line
to a red oak corner of Turton Grotto land thence by a line of marked trees to a red oak corner of said
line thence by said line to a pine corner at Curr Bowers thence by Bowers line to the first station con-
-tinuing by estimation Thirtly acres more or less together with all the reversion and reversionary remainders
and remainders yearly and other rents issues and profits and every part and parcel thereof. To have
