 of Virginia of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Francis M Boykin & Hester Ann his wife for and in
 consideration of four hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said John Wick at and before
 the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged I hath bargained
 and sold unto by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said John Wick his
 heirs or assigns a certain tract of land or parcel of land known as a part of the Colliers tract contain
 ing four hundred and forty acres be the same more or less the boundaries of which will more fully
 appear by reference to the report of the Commissioners who divided the estate of Henry Briggs do which
 is of record in the Clerk's office of the County of Southampton together with all and singular the
 improvements and all other appurtenances therunto belonging or appertaining thereto. To have and to
 hold the said tract or parcel of land unto the said John Wick his heirs and assigns forever, and
 the said Francis M Boykin and Hester Ann his wife for themselves and their heirs the said land
 with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said John Wick his
 heirs and assigns forever free from the claim of them the said Francis M Boykin and Hester Ann
