This Indenture made and entered into between Drury Bittle of the County of Hampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Edmund Underwood of the same County and State of the other part Hengeth that whereas the said Edmund Underwood having made and conveyed by deed of Trust to the S^d Drury Bittle Trustee for the benefit of Henry Hindred to secure certain debts to the said Hindred a certain tract of Land left S^d Underwood by his Father it being the plantation whereon the S^d Underwood resides containing two hundred and sixty acres: and whereas Elizabeth Harris having p^d and settled all such claims due S^d Hindred: This Indenture witnesseth that the S^d Drury Bittle for and in consideration of the premises and the further consideration of Elizabeth Harris having settled and paid off all such claims as may be due in the aforesaid deed of Trust bearing date the 26th April 1836 and duly recorded here this day released set over and by these presents doth release set over &c unto the said Benⁿ Underwood his heirs and assigns forever: all the right title and Int^y that the S^d Drury Bittle may hold in and to the above named tract of Land &c by virtue of of the above named deed in Trust: and doth by these presents forever acquit and release the S^d Benⁿ Underwood from all and every of the obligations and conditions of the deed of Trust aforesaid. In Testimony whereof the said Drury Bittle hath this 30th Decr 1839 set his hand and seal.
