I seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of January 1840

Suffolk County Decem 31<sup>st</sup> 1839

I Edwin H Dilk of the Borough of Norfolk do hereby certify that I have this day had a full and final Settlement with my brother Thomas N Dilk administrator of the Estate of John Gyles deceased my late Guardian and have received of him five hundred and Ninety nine dollars and ninety three cents the balance in full due me from my said late guardian. I have also received of my said Brother Thomas N Dilk administration of the Estate of the said John Gyles deceased my half of the estate of the said John Gyles deceased in full. These are therefore to release acquit and discharge the said Thomas N Dilk above mentioned from any claim demand suit or prosecution of any kind not only as relates to the transactions of my said late guardian but also as relates to my half of his estate after paying me the said balance due upon his guardianship transactions.

This Indenture made and entered into this 20<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year of our Lord 1838 between John A Stewart and Agnes E his wife of the County of Greenwich State of New York of the one part and George A W Newson of the County of Southampton of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John A Stewart & wife Agnes E for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and Ninety dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof the said Stewart and wife do hereby acknowledge and acquit the said George A W Newson from further payment in this behalf. Have granted bargained sold alienated parted and by these presents do grant bargain sell alienate enfeoff and confirm unto the said George A W Newson a certain piece or parcel of Land lying in the said County of Southampton State of New York containing 174 acres more or less it being that portion of Land which was allotted to the said Agnes E as one of the children to distribute of Ruth Nicholson deceased of Southampton the widow of the said John A Stewart & Agnes E his wife in the land which was allotted to the said Ruth Nicholson as her dower in the sum of her due & husband the said Ruth Nicholson reference being had to the report of the Commissioners who set apart the said dower and who apportioned the land of the said Ruth Nicholson among his children to distribution of record in Southampton County the situation & boundaries of said land & interest in dower also the number of acres will appear. To have and to hold the piece of land aforesaid which was apportioned to the said Agnes E as aforesaid also their interest in the dower land aforesaid to have the said George A W Newson his heirs and assigns forever against the claims of themselves or either of them or either of their heirs and assigns forever against the claims of themselves or either of the said parties of the first part have herunto set their hands & seals the day & date first written
