This Indenture made this 10th day of Nov. in the year of our Lord 1839 between Samuel B. Robinson of Southampton City and State of Va. the debtor of the first part, Joseph S. Holland of Isle of Wight ^{City} the trustee, of the second part, and John M. Holland of Hanover County and State of Va. the creditor of the third part whereas the said Robinson is justly indebted to the said John M. Holland in the sum of four hundred 75^{cts} to be paid on the 20th day of Dec. in the year first above mentioned as by bond bearing date the 16th day of November 1839. more fully appears which debt with the legal interest thereon accruing the said Samuel B. Robinson is willing and desirous to secure. Now this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the property and also for the further consideration of One dollar to the said Samuel B. Robinson (the debtor) in hand paid by the said Joseph S. Holland (the trustee) at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Robinson both given granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed released and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien enfeoff release and confirm to the said Joseph S. Holland his heirs and assigns forever One boy named Mike & One girl named Melthy and her future increase and all the right title and interest of the said Samuel B. Robinson in and to the s^d granted or intended to be hereby granted slaves. To have and to hold the said hereby granted or intended to be hereby granted the aforesaid slaves and the future increase of the females thereof and all the other personal property hereby conveyed unto the said Joseph S. Holland his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of the s^d Joseph S. Holland, his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever, and the s^d S. B. Robinson for himself his heirs Executors and administrators doth hereby covenant promise and agree to and with the said Joseph S. Holland his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever in manner and form following that is to say that the s^d Samuel B. Robinson his heirs Executors administrators the aforesaid slaves and the future increase of the females thereof and all the personal property hereby conveyed unto the s^d Joseph S. Holland &c. his heirs Executors administrators and assigns against all persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents upon trust nevertheless that the said Joseph S. Holland &c. his heirs Executors and administrators shall permit the said Samuel B. Robinson to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the s^d slaves and other personal property hereby conveyed and take the profits thereof to his own use until default be made in the payment of the said bond of Four hundred dollars 75^{cts} either in whole or in part and then upon this further trust that they or any two or either of them or the survivor of them or the heirs Executors administrators or assigns of such survivor shall and well to soon after the happening of such default of payment as they or either of them may think proper or the said John M. Holland his heirs Executors administrators assigns shall request sell the said slaves and the future increase of the females thereof and all the other personal property hereby conveyed or such part of the same hereby granted as the trustee or his representatives duly authorized to act shall think sufficient for the purchase and shall think to sell to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction after having first at the time and place of sale at their own discretion and given two days notice thereof in writing to the same by advertisement to be set up at the door of the Courthouse of the aforesaid County on some Court day previous to the day of sale and out of the moneys arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges attending such sale pay to the said John M. Holland his heirs Executors administrators or assigns the s^d sum of Four hundred dollars 75^{cts} with the interest thereon have accrued and the balance if any shall pay to the s^d S. B. Robinson his heirs or assigns
