This Indenture made and entered into this 30th day of December in the year of our Lord 1839 between Edmund Underwood and his wife Susan Underwood of the one part, and Elizabeth Harris all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the other part, (Witnesseth) that the said Edmund Underwood and his wife Susan have this day for and in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred and Seventy five dollars good and lawful money to them in hand paid by the said Elizabeth Harris at and before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged (each gives granted bargained sold delivered and confirmed and by these presents do give grant bargain sell deliver and confirm unto the said Elizabeth Harris to her heirs heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton and Adjacent bounded by the lands of Josephus Darden Rich^d Porter, William Williams formerly Abhis Darden and the lands of Drury White containing by old survey the quantity of Two Hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less together with all Houses out Doves orchards and improvements of every kind thereunto attached or in any way belonging, and the said Edmund Underwood and his wife Susan Underwood both by these presents furthermore covenant and agree with the said Elizabeth Harris a good and perfect right and title to the aforesaid Land & improvements to warrant and forever defend unto the said Elizabeth Harris and her heirs forever against the claims of them the said Edmund Underwood & wife Susan Underwood their and every of their heirs Aforesaid and of all other persons claiming and demand of all and every other person whatsoever.
