Thomas at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Willis & Beale hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents does grant bargain & sell unto the said John W. Thomas his heirs executors and administrators forever, the following property to wit: One tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid containing by estimation One hundred and One and a half acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit: On the West and North by the lands of the said Thomas Newson on the East by the lands of Benjamin J. Darrin and on the South by the lands of Peter Colanwith also one Negro man named Dury. To have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land with its premises and appurtenances unto the said John W. Thomas unto the said John W. Thomas his heirs executors and administrators forever. Upon Trust Whosoever that the said Willis & Beale is to return possession of the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land and its appurtenances and the said Negro man Dury unto the said John W. Thomas to his own use and as soon as may be made in the payment of the said sum of Three hundred and fifty dollars together with the interest thereon accrued but if the Willis & Beale or his heirs executors or administrators shall neglect or refuse to pay to the said Thomas Newson his heirs executors administrators or assigns the said sum of Three hundred and fifty dollars
