This Indenture made and entered into on this 11th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty between Barton Taylor of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Richard Harris of same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Barton Taylor for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said Richard Harris at & before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and confirm unto him the said Richard Harris his heirs and assigns forever. One certain tract or parcel of Land (situated lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and containing three hundred acres more or less) together with the Lands of Benj^l Wallis James Turner Marcus Hopf and Nathans St Thomas. Together with all the right title interest claim or demand of in and to the above described tract or parcel of Land and premises with its appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining. To have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land and premises with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging unto him the said Richard Harris his heirs and assigns forever and the said Barton Taylor for himself his heirs executors and administrators doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Richard Harris his heirs executors administrators and assigns that he will by these presents warrant and defend the right and title of the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land and premises and every part or parcel thereof against the claims or demands of all and every person or persons whatsoever. This Indenture made this 21st day of August 1837 Between Henry Kinross and Lucy his wife of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of the one part and Edward Beaton of the same County and State (Virg) of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Henry Kinross and wife Lucy for and in consideration of the sum of more hundred and eighteen dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted sold aliened and confirmed and do by these presents grant bargain sell alien and confirm unto the said Edward Beaton his heirs and assigns forever. One certain piece lot and parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid and on the South side of the Turners Road and bounded on the North by the line of the Beaton's line and on the South by Beaton's line and on the East by Beaton's line and on the West by Middleton's line one the South by Beaton's line and on the East by Beaton's line to the Beginning at 2^d corner by estimation one hundred Twelve and a half acres more or less. To have and to hold all and singular the said granted Land and premises above mentioned unto the said Edward Beaton his heirs and assigns forever and the said Henry Kinross and wife Lucy for themselves their heirs &c doth further and agree to and with the said Edward Beaton his heirs &c that they will forever warrant and defend the right title & interest of the said premises aforementioned unto him the said Edward Beaton his heirs and assigns forever against the claims & demands of them the said Henry Kinross and wife Lucy their heirs and assigns forever and any other person or persons whatsoever claiming by front or under them.
