This Indenture made this 20th day of February in the year of our Lord which one thousand eight hundred and forty between Anselm Denson and Mary Ann his wife of the County of Southampton and Parish of Stollaway of the one part and George B. Holloman of the same County and parish of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Anselm Denson and Mary Ann his wife for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and thirty four dollars and 60th cents good and lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said George B. Holloman the receipt whereof the said Anselm Denson and Mary Ann his wife do acknowledge themselves fully and amply satisfied and paid hath granted bargained sold aliened conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said George B. Holloman his heirs and assigns forever. One certain tract or parcel of Land and premises situate lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by a late Survey made by the County Surveyor 1834 or thereabouts the same more or less and bounded as follows (to wit) Commencing at the road in George Burps line and running S 75° E 50 poles the Road S 61° E 71.24 to Brunch's line of 44 poles thence S 73° E 2.64 92 poles a Red oak in Brunch's line S 65° E 11.72 a pine S 76° E 15. 97 62.21 14 Oak S 61° E 18 to the branch at a S. Guard a corner in Mrs Hancocks line & Mrs Geo. Brunch's thence the various measures to its junction with sea cock thence up the sea water to the mouth of the River Rose thence the various measures of the rocky shore to the Road and beginning together with all Houses out Houses edifices building grounds Gardens Orchards ways waters and water courses whatsoever lying or in any wise appertaining therunto. To have and to hold the said land and premises to him and to his heirs forever and the said Anselm Denson and Mary Ann his wife for themselves their heirs &c. doth by these presents covenant and grant to and with the said George B. Holloman his heirs and assigns that they will by these presents warrant and forever defend all right title claim or demand of any person or persons claiming or demanding the same or any part or parcel thereof On Witness whereof the said Anselm Denson and Mary Ann his wife hath hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year Written Witness as
