This Indenture made and entered into on this 11<sup>th</sup> day of December in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty nine between William Spencer of the first part Josiah Ferguson trustee of the second part and Thos B Worrell and Lewis Worrell of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia whereas the said William Spencer is justly indebted to the said Thos B Worrell by bond bearing date with these presents for the sum of twelve dollars and forty five cents and to the said Lewis Worrell by bond bearing even date with these presents for the sum of Twenty four dollars and seventy two cents which and to be with the legal interest thereon occurring the said William Spencer is willing and desirous to become a free man this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said William Spencer in hand paid by the said Josiah Ferguson (trustee) at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged to the said William Spencer hath given granted bargained sold released and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell release and confirm to the said Josiah Ferguson trustee his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit One feather bed and furniture 1 pair Table two feet 1 large Iron pot and hooks 1 Iron pot rack 1 cushion with 8 side plates six chairs framed 12<sup>ft</sup> two wood boxes 1 killing box 1 Drawing knife 1 set Cups & saucers 1 case knives & forks 1 box knife two tubs 1 piggins 1 mogen 1 bucket 1 Lons & harness 1 Cupboard 1 hand saw 1 stone for them wedge 1 red sow & three shotes four barrels corn 4 bushels and one Coffe mill. To have and to hold the above hereby granted or intended to be hereby granted property unto the said Josiah Ferguson as trustee his heirs executors admis<sup>d</sup> and assigns forever and the said William Spencer for himself his heirs executors admis<sup>d</sup> & doth hereby covenant promise and agree to and with the said Josiah Ferguson trustee his heirs executors admis<sup>d</sup> and assigns that he will by these presents warrant and forever defend the right and title of the aforesaid property against the claims or demands of all and every other person or persons whatsoever. Upon trust nevertheless for the following intent and purposes that is to say that the said Josiah Ferguson or his legal representatives may and shall at any time hereafter when thence required by either the said William Spencer or said Thos B Worrell and Lewis Worrell or either of their representatives sell all the aforesaid property being conveyed to the highest bidder for ready money after giving at least ten days previous publick notice of the time and place of such sale by advertisements posted up at three or more public places in the neighborhood and out of the monies arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereby and all other expenses attending the execution of these presents pay to the said Thos B Worrell his executors
