Witnesseth that the said John Waddell for & in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars (secured to be paid unto the said John Waddell by the said Joel B. Jones & James Delilah at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents) hath bargained granted & sold, by these presents with grant bargain & sell unto the said Joel B. Jones & Joel Delilah their heirs Executors admors or assigns the certain tract or parcel of Land whereof the said Joel Waddell Testator as aforesaid died seized & possessed containing two hundred & fifty acres more or less bounded by the lands of Samuel Willford Thomas Johnson and the Road leading from Greensland to Black Water, but for a more particular description of the said Land reference may be had to the deed from Rich^d C. Williams & wife to Joel Waddell admitted to Record the 16th day of November 1838. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land to gether with all and singular the premises and appurtenances thereto belonging except one half acre of Land in the garden reserved by the last will & Testament of the said Testator for a burying ground & on which the said Testator J.
