Articles of Agreement made and entered into the 18th day of December 1837 between Lewis Merrill of the first part and Martha D. Trigant wife of Theodore Trigant of the second part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said Lewis Merrill for and in consideration of the sum of Seven hundred dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Martha D. Trigant and her heirs and assigns forever: a certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the Indian woods & laid off to ground and Henry Turned Indians supposed to be one hundred and forty acres more or less & purchased from the said Indians by Henry Turned by my Father Lewis Merrill as reference to the records will more fully appear being said South broad side by the lands of Henry B. Vaughan late purchase from the Indians (Edy Turned & Mr. Burman) and North by the whole Indian tract running East & west as far as the lands are at present laid off with the reversions and reversions remainders and remainders unto four and fourths thereof. To have and to hold to the said Martha D. Trigant her heirs and assigns forever: and the said Lewis Merrill for his heirs and himself and assigns hereby warrant and defend the title of the aforesaid tract of Land to the said Martha D. Trigant and her heirs and assigns forever. In Testimony whereof the said Lewis Merrill have hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal this day and year first above written a Teste

This Indenture made the 20th day of March 1820 between Theodore Trigant of the first part, Leticia R. Edwards of the second part and James I. French of the Third part. Witnesseth that whereas the said Theodore Trigant is this day indebted to the said James I. French in the sum of two thousand three hundred and thirty six dollars eight six cents, by bond bearing date this day, nearly one half of which amount has been heretofore advanced by the said J. I. French in payment of debts due from the said T. Trigant to citizens of Southampton and in consequence thereof the said T. Trigant being anxious to secure and indemnify the said J. I. French against all loss. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said T. Trigant for and in consideration of the above premises as well as for the further consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the said L. R. Edwards the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said L. R. Edwards his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit One tract or parcel of Land containing about fifty acres lying in the Indian woods, and being the same which said Trigant purchased of Henry Williams and Indians and which said land is known and the Indians call it No 5. also another tract or parcel of Land lying in the Indian woods adjoining the former, containing about one hundred and forty acres it being the same which Lewis Merrill bought of Henry Turned Indians and sold to T. Trigant with all their Tenements appurtenances &c. also what ever interest the said T. Trigant may have in or to a claim which he has against Eliza Barclay or whatever amount he may recover against Britton Bunceley and wife formerly Eliza Weddle in the said now pending in the Circuit Superior Court of Southampton. Also whatever interest the said T. Trigant may have in or to the house and lot where he now resides in the Town of Jerusalem or whatever interest the said Trigant, or any person for him may recover in any future action for the same. also two horses about twenty barrels of Corn about fifteen hundred pounds of beef two hogs of Land two head
