Articles of Agreement made and entered into this 18<sup>th</sup> day of December 1837 Eighteen hundred and thirty seven. Between Lewis Worrell of the first part and Martha D. Troyrant wife of Theodore Troyrant of the second part all of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia witnesseth that the said Lewis Worrell for and in consideration of the sum of Seven hundred dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Martha D. Troyrant and her heirs and assigns forever: a certain tract or parcel of land laying in the Indian woods & laid off to ground and Henry Turned Indians supposed to be one hundred and forty acres more or less to purchase from the said Green & Henry Turned by my Father Lewis Worrell as reference to the accords will more fully appear bounded South broad side by the lands of Henry B. Vaughan late purchase from the Indians (Eddy Town now of Mr. Burroughs) and North by the whole Indian tract running East & west so far as the lands are at present laid off with the reversions and reversions remainders and remainders ipsius and profits thereof. To have and to hold to the said Martha D. Troyrant her heirs and assigns forever: and the said Lewis Worrell for his heirs and himself and assigns hereby warrant and defend the Title of the aforesaid tract of Land to the said Martha D. Troyrant and her heirs and assigns forever. And Testimony whereof the said Lewis Worrell have hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal this day and year first above written.

This Indenture made this 20<sup>th</sup> day of March 1820 between Theodore Troyrant of the first part, Lithia R. Edwards of the second part and James G. French of the third part witnesseth that whereas the said Theodore Troyrant is this day indebted to the said James G. French in the sum of two thousand three hundred and six dollars eighty six cents, by bond bearing date this day, nearly one half of which amount has been heretofore advanced by the said J. G. French as payment of debt due from the said T. Troyrant to citizens of Southampton and in consequence thereof the said T. Troyrant being anxious to secure and indemnify the said J. G. French against all loss. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said T. Troyrant for and in consideration of the above promises as well as for the further Consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid at or before the sealing and delivering of these presents by the said R. Edwards the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged both granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said R. Edwards his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit One tract or parcel of Land containing about fifty acres lying in the Indian woods, and being the same which said Troyrant purchased of Henry Williams and Indians and which land is known as the Indian Plot no. 185. also another tract or parcel of Land lying in the Indian woods adjoining the former, containing about one hundred and forty acres it being the same which Lewis Worrell bought of Green and Henry Turned Indians and sold to T. Troyrant with all their tenements appurtenances &c: also whatever interest the said T. Troyrant may have in or to a claim which he has against Elija Barely or wheresoever amount he may receive against Elija Barely and wife formerly Elija Weddle in the said sum pending in the Circuit Superior Court of Southampton. Also whatever interest the said T. Troyrant may have in or to the house where he now resides in the Town of Southampton or whatever interest he has in the said Troyrant, or any person for him in any account in any future actions for the same. also two horses about twenty hours of Cours about fifteen hundred pounds of bacon two hogs of Land two head
