Know all men by these presents that we Alfred Stephenson John Vick & Benj^a Griffin ex- hold and firmly bound unto David Campbell Esq Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia with just and full bond of five thousand dollars to be paid to the said Governor and his successor for the use of the Commonwealth for the payment whereof well and truly to be made in compliance with his Executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals and dated this 16th day of March 1840.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound Alfred Stephenson has been appointed by the Court of Southampton County to serve as Constable within the said County to supply the vacancy created by the resignation of James E. Clayton. Now if the said Alfred Stephenson shall well and truly discharge the duties of the office of Constable in the said County during his continuance therein then the above obligation to be void or else to remain in full force and Virtue.

This Indenture made the 1st day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty. Between Littleton R Edwards of the first part, John S Drake administrator of Elizabeth Drake dead of the second part, and Ethelred Drake of the third part. Whereas the said Elizabeth Drake on the 15th day of June for the year 1833 in order to secure the payment of the sum of Ninety three dollars and 22 cents to the said Elizabeth Drake due by Insurrection of bond of that date convey to the said Littleton R Edwards his heirs and assigns the following property to wit a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid and containing by estimation fifty three acres. Upon trust for the use and purposes in said Insurrection mentioned. And whereas since the execution and delivery of said deed of trust the said Ethelred Drake hath fully satisfied and paid to the said John S Drake ad^r of Elizabeth Drake the debt thereby secured which the said John S Drake admits aforesaid with hearty acknowledgment. Now this Indenture Witnesseth that for the consideration aforesaid as well as for the further cove- nant of one dollar in hand paid by the said Ethelred Drake at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Littleton R Edwards as being a party to these presents and the said John S Drake agrees as aforesaid with the assent and approbation of the said John S Drake ad^r as aforesaid.
