Know all men by these presents that I John Denogre of the County of Southampton (Virginia) for
and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I bear to my son John A Denogre of the
County of Richmond as well as for the further consideration of five dollars to me in hand paid by the said
John A Denogre at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged)
have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said John A Denogre his heirs and assigns
and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land called the Ponds tract and containing one hundred and fifty
acres more or less beginning at the road near the Bridge adjoining Joseph A Wick's land at a corner first
thence following the ditch on the back part of John Denogre's two-acre to a creek and thence the
meanders of the branch down to John Denogre's old tract thence down to the said branch to a white oak
thence a straight line about South west down to the Capshank thence down the Capshank and up
Crompter branch to John Ponds' orphan's tract of land - thence straight line about N. east up the
Petersburg Road thence crossing the said road adjoining Robert Ricks' land and Joseph A Wick's
land up to the Road to the first station. To have and to hold the said tract of Land together with
the two house Blk Smith shop, Tailors shop Mill house &c and finally all its appurtenances
