This Indenture made this 7th day of August 1839 Between Benjamin W Brille of the one part, and William Harrison of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the other part, Witnesseth that I the said Benjamin W Brille for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and Ten dollars to him in hand paid before the sealing and delivering of the said of one the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and himself to be therewith fully satisfied contented and sold and confirmed unto him the said William Harrison one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton, bounded as follows, beginning at a pine corner on the said William Harrison thence North 63 West 82 poles to a small black gum then North 37 West 10 poles thence North 67 West 20 poles to a black gum a corner on the said Benjamin W Brille thence a new line of marked trees North 82 East 180 poles to a small gum standing in a branch called Hurts quit thence up said branch the several courses of the road 57 poles to a marked pine thence South 45 West 4 poles to a red oak thence South 62 West 10 poles to a red oak thence South 57 West 45 poles to the beginning containing forty five acres and fifty three rods more or less. To have and to hold the said land promised to him the said William Harrison his heirs and assigns forever, together with all and singular the appurtenances profits and emoluments to the same in any manner belonging and I the said Benjamin W Brille do hereby for myself my heirs executors or administrators power warrant and defend with good and perfect right and title to the said tract or parcel of land to him the said William Harrison his heirs and assigns against the claim or demand of any person or persons whatsoever. This Indenture made this 23^d day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four Between John Williams and Margaret his wife of the one part, and Edward Butts of the other part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Witnesseth that the said John Williams and wife his wife in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars in hand paid have granted bargain and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Edward Butts and his heirs a certain tract or parcel of land situated lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid and on the west side of the Appomattock Swamp and in the forks of said Swamp and Nottoway River containing by estimation fifty acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a black gum on the side of the Road leading from the Burn Swamp to the Appomattock Bridge thence around the Road to pine stumps, thence to a black gum in Thomas C Holladay late George Hobbs line thence a line of marked trees to a white oak a corner of Thomas C Holladay late George Hobbs of the land forming the property of Elias Hobbs do? from thence a line of marked trees to a scrub white oak a corner on Thomas Holladay late George Hobbs line from thence a line of marked trees a crop kirbys the road to a Red oak a corner of Benjamin Hobbs and Edwards Butts land and from thence a straight line to the beginning it being the tract or parcel of land which the said John Williams purchased of Benjamin Hobbs and sold to Benjamin his wife which will more fully appear by reference to their deed bearing date the 20th day of January 1828 and recorded in the Clerk's office of the County of Southampton. To have and to hold the said land together with the appurtenances to him the said Edward Butts and his heirs forever, and the said John Williams and Margaret his wife do hereby warrant and each of their heirs executors and administrators the said tract or parcel of land with the
