This deed of bargain and sale from James M. Howell to James C. Webb, was proved by the oaths of Alpheus E.  
Norcross and Godward Horn, and having been countersigned thereto,  
1844 by the oaths of William Joyce and the other witness above, is now made to record.

This Indenture made 15<sup>th</sup> June 1840 between Edmund L Bailey of the first part James Peters of the second part & Mrs Mallory of the third part all of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia whereas the said Bailey is fully indebted to the said Mrs Mallory in the sum of ninety nine dollars fifty eight cents due the first day of January 1840 and eighty dollars due by her contracted since the date of the above note and being desirous to secure the payment of the same now This Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar in hand paid by the said Peters the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said Bailey does by these presents grant bargains & sell to Convey unto the said Peters his heirs and assigns forever One negro man named George two Horses One Cow and Calf 3 foal & two colts 1 buffal 1 walnut table one pine do one Cart w wheels 12 horses & forks all my dishes & plates my growing Crop of every kind & description one Sow & 16 shoots and the said Bailey for himself his heirs Executors &c does covenant with the said Peters his heirs & assigns that he the said Bailey will & his heirs shall warrant & defend the same to the said Peters his heirs & assigns against the lawful claims & demands of all persons whatsoever Upon trust nevertheless that the said Peters his heirs &c shall permit the said Bailey to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the above named property until the said Mallory shall direct the said Peters to sell the said property each after giving 10 days notice of the time and place of sale but if the said Bailey shall satisfy the within stated claims & entitlent that may be due on them this deed shall be void otherwise remains in full force and virtue and if Peters the trustee <sup>should</sup> sell the property or a part thereof he is first to pay the cost attending this deed & sale this the day of year aforesaid In Testimony whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals.

hundred and thirty seven between Nathaniel J Williams and Elsey A his wife of the County of South  
ampton and state of Virginia of the one part and Nathan B Bryant of the same County and state of the  
other part witnesseth that the said Nathaniel J Williams and Elsey A his wife for and in Considera-  
tion of the sum of two Thousand five hundred dollars current money of this Commonwealth to them  
in hand paid by the said Nathan Bryant at and before the making and delivery of these presents  
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents  
doth grant bargain and sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto him the said Nathan B Bryant his  
heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of Land (Sedale) lying and being in the  
foresaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Lukes Containing by a recent Survey  
seven hundred and sixty three acres to it the sume more or less it being a part of the tract of land  
called Middlebrook and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at the mouth of the yellow gut or  
Meherrin River thence up the run of said gut Seventy poles thence 28 poles to the mouth
