Bellamy or his legal representatives but if the whole of the said sum of one hundred and fifty dollars shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said Allen Edwards or his representatives within the term be demanded so that no default be made in the payment of the said sum of one hundred and fifty dollars then this Indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and a Witness In Witness whereof the said parties have hereunto set their hands and seals this day and date first written.

This Indenture made the eight day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty Between William Harris Patrick Rowe and Matthew Wells Common Pleas of the one part and William Turner of the other part. Witnesseth that the said William Harris Patrick Rowe and Matthew Wells Common Pleas in of forty nine dollars lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said William Turner at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said William Turner his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land containing thirty five acres or the same more or less and bounded (Viz) beginning at a corner Tree a Spanish oak standing in Matthew Wells and William Harris line thence a straight line of marked trees between the said land and William Harris to the Cypress Swamp to a corner Tree a black Gum standing in the said swamp Between the said land William Harris and Jeff. Lunkford thence up the swamp between the said land and Jeff. Lunkford to the mouth of a small branch thence up the said branch Between the said land and a Matthew Wells to the beginning. Together with all the singular houses dovecotes barns buildings stables yards gardens orchards lands Tenements Meadows pastures foraging commons woods underwoods ways waters water courses fishing privileges profits easements commodities advantages emoluments hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said land belonging or appertaining or the same used or enjoyed or accepted reputed taken or known as part parcel or member thereof or as belonging to the same or any part thereof and belonging
