This Indenture made and entered into on this 19th day of June Year 1880 by and between John
Pope of the first part Thomas Magot of the second part and Jacob Williams and Elisha Pope of the
third part all of whom reside in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. This Indenture wit-
nesseth that whereas they the said Jacob Williams and Elisha Pope sometime previous to this day became
jointly bound with the said John Pope as security for him in the payment of the following debt
that is to say first to J. B. Burchard and Henry Hindes for the sum of Sixty six dollars and
ninety six cents same due June 11th 1880 secondly to Anthony Vaughan for the sum of Two
hundred and sixty six dollars and eighty two cents same due June 15th 1880 and the said John
Pope in order to indemnify the said Jacob Williams and Elisha Pope from any loss or becoming
suffered by the means of said securityship have and do hereby bargain and sell unto them the Thomas
Magot his heirs and assigns the following named property to wit: Three Beds and furniture four
Tables & carpets Two Trunkers common two Tin Trunkers Two cupboards Crockery plates and tin ware
Three common Chests Twelve common Chairs Three Chests a parcel of plantation tools to wit
Saw axes, adze, draw knife &c. Two pots with hooks Two spades one hoe one Clock one and one
Mixer five wash tubs one grindstone one Cow and calf one yearling one sow and pigs one
Cart and wheels to same Cart gear Bridle and saddle and the said John Pope whole interest in
land negroes &c. formally the property of his Father John Pope dec'd. To have and to hold the
above named and described property and also said John Pope's interest in and to the lands above
formally his Father's to him the said Thomas Magot his heirs and assigns forever: Now know
nevertheless that is to say if he the said John Pope pays or causes to be paid the above named
two debts due and owing as aforesaid to and for which they the said Jacob Williams and Elisha
Pope are with him the said John Pope jointly and jointly bound as security to pay or cause to be
paid that then and in that case this indenture shall be void and of no effect but in case they
the said Jacob Williams and Elisha Pope or either of them voluntarily and of their own
accord pay the debt aforesaid or in case they or either of the said debts be recovered by process of
law so that the said Jacob Williams and Elisha Pope or either of them their or either of their
heirs Executors or administrators become sufferers on account of said securityship then and in either
event it shall be lawful and not only lawful but the bounden duty of them the said Thomas
Magot his heirs and assigns when required so to do by the said Jacob Williams and Elisha Pope or either of them
