French his heirs &c. for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and ten dollars the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged One hundred and ten dollars of which is paid by bond bearing date this day all right title and interest whatever which I may have, or now have in or to a tract or parcel of land situate under a decree of the Circuit Sup^r Ct. of Southampton at it April Term 1830 in a suit against Turner and others vs. Nottoway Indians which said tract or parcel of land has not yet been marked out by the Surveyor but its boundaries will appear by reference to a report of the Commissioners returned under said decree. To have and to hold the same to the said James P. French his heirs &c. free from the claim or claims of all persons whatever the title to which I will forever warrant and defend. Witnesseth that the said Parsons Turner for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and sixty dollars to him in hand paid by the James P. French the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged doth grant bargain and sell and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell and convey unto James P. French his heirs and assigns all right title interest and claim whatever which he the said Parsons Turner received under a decree of the Circuit Sup^r Ct. of Law and Chancery for the County of Southampton at it April Term 1830 in a suit or petition given Turner & others vs. Nottoway Trustees which said interest is in land and has not yet been marked out by the Surveyor but its boundaries will fully appear by reference to a report of the Comm^rs returned in compliance with the decree before referred to. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said James P. French his heirs &c. assigns forever - and the said Parsons Turner hereby covenants and agrees with the said James P. French his heirs &c. that he will forever warrant and defend the title to the same against the claim or claims of all persons whatever.
