This Indenture made and entered into this 25th day of July one thousand eight hundred and fifty between Wm^m J. Blow of the first part and Archer Vick of the second part and John M. Gentry of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia: Whereas the said John M. Gentry became security to a certain bond executed to John C. Sumner for one hundred and twenty five dollars payable the first of January next for the said Wm^m J. Blow and the said Blow being desirous to secure the said John M. Gentry for his liability as aforesaid: Now this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of one dollar lawful money to the said Wm^m J. Blow in hand paid by the said Archer Vick at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said William J. Blow hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell and confirm to the said Archer Vick his heirs executors admors and assigns forever his present growing Crop of Cotton pees potatoes apples fodder and all other Crops cultivated on the plantation rented from the said Sumner: To have and to hold the said Crop hereby conveyed unto the said Archer Vick his heirs and assigns forever upon trust nevertheless that the said Wm^m J. Blow shall be permitted to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said Crop hereby conveyed until default be made in payment of the said bond either in part or the whole or that the said Gentry shall be likely to suffer by said Securityship then it shall be the duty of the said Archer Vick his heirs executors admors or assigns at the request of the said Gentry to advance and sell to the highest bidder the said Crop hereby conveyed after giving due notice of such sale and the proceeds arising therefrom first pay and satisfy the cost of carrying into effect these proceedings secondly pay off the bond and interest if any as above described and the surplus if any pay to the said William J.
