This Indenture made this 13<sup>th</sup> day of May in the year of our Lord 1840 between John Lewis and his wife Catharine Lewis of the one part and William Harris of the other part all of the County of Southampton State of Virginia and Parish of Newbury Wintonsett that the said John Lewis & Catharine his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve dollars of lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said William Harris at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them bargain and sell unto the said William Harris his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land containing by estimation six acres more or less and bounded as followeth beginning at a post oak a corner of William Harris line (the land he purchased of Willis Ward) thence a line of marked trees to a guard a corner in the poor house land thence a line of marked trees to a point a corner of said Harris land and thence a line of marked trees to the beginning together with all and singular the houses out houses buildings yards gardens way waters and water courses privileges profits commodities advantages hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said land belonging or in any wise appertaining to the same or any part thereof. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with all and singular the premises herein before mentioned with every part and parcel unto the said William Harris his heirs and assigns forever and the said John Lewis & Catharine his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract or parcel of Land with all and singular the premises herein before mentioned unto the said William Harris his heirs and assigns forever of them or their heirs and assigns all and every other person whatsoever shall and do warrant and defend by these presents.
