receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained sold and delivered unto Seth D. Williams the following
property 1 Bed, stand and furniture 1 set chairs 1 pot and spider and oven 1 still kinnis and forks
Spongs (the following property is now in the possession of Pinchon Cobb) and I the said Thomas Lawrence
do for my self my heirs and assigns forever warrant and defend the just right and title to the said
property unto Seth D. Williams to him and his heirs forever. And Witness whereof I have hereunto set

This Indenture made this 10th day of April 1840 between John Boyd in right of Jacob Turner one of
the sons and heirs of John Turner dec^d late of the County of Southampton of the 1st part James Turner
another of the sons and heirs of said John Turner of the second part and Gilbert Syms and Patience his
wife in right of Patience a daughter and heir of said Solomon Turner of another part. Witnesseth
that it is covenanted and agreed between the parties for a partition to be had and made of the
inheritance of the lands Tenements and Hereditaments which descended to the said Jacob
Turner. Turners Turner and Patience Turner in coparcenary by and after the death of their
Father in manner and form following. First it is covenanted and agreed ^{between} the said parties
and the said John Boyd in right of Jacob Turner and James Turner doth grant by these
presents that the said Gilbert Syms and Patience his wife all that portion of the land of the
late John Turner lying on the main Road and bounded as follows: South by the main Road
West by John Monroes Land. North by a line of chopped trees and East by the lands of John
Boyd the said land by consent of Parties being appertained to Sally Turner the widow of the
said John Turner and mother of the aforesaid, Jacob, James and Patience as her share and
of course is to enjoy the quiet and undisturbed possession of it during her life and the said
John Boyd in right of Jacob Turner and Gilbert Syms and Patience his wife doth grant by
these presents unto James Turner that portion of John Turners land called Claytons tract and
bounded as follows North by the lands of Mr Bowyer North west by the lands of Benjamin
Hend West by the land of John Bowyer and South by John Monroes land and East a
branch (called Claytons Branch which) divides it from John Boyds portion of
John Turners Land to the said James Turner and his heirs forever and the said James
Turner and Gilbert Syms and Patience his wife doth grant by these presents unto
John Boyd that portion of John Turners land called Evans tract and bounded
as follows North by the lands of Mr Bowyer and South by John Monroes land
