of Virginia for and in consideration of the sum of five dollars to me in hand paid by Seth D. Williams the  
receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained sold and delivered unto Seth D. Williams the following  
property 1 Bed,stead and furniture 1 Set chairs 1 pot and spade and 2 end 1 Still knives and forks  
spoon (the following property is known in the possession of Hinches both) and I the said Thomas Lawrence  
do for my self my heirs and assigns forever warrant and defend the just right and title to the said  
property unto Seth D. Williams to him and his heirs forever. In witness whereof I have hereunto set  
my hand and seal this 6<sup>th</sup> day of July 1840

This indenture made this 10<sup>th</sup> day of April <sup>1840</sup> between John Boyle in right of Jacob Turner one of  
the sons and heirs of John Turner deceased late of the County of Southampton of the first part James Turner  
Turner of all another of the sons and heirs of said John Turner of the second part and Gilbert Tynes and Patience his  
wife in right of Patience a Daughter and heir of said Solomon Turner of another part. Witnesseth  
that it is covenanted and agreed between the parties for a partition to be had and made of the  
inheritance of the lands, tenements and hereditaments which descended to the said Jacob  
Turner, James Turner and Patience Turner in coparcenary by and after the death of their  
Father in manner and form following. First it is covenanted and agreed by the said parties  
and the said John Boyle in right of Jacob Turner and James Turner doth grant by these  
presents that the said Gilbert Tynes and Patience his wife all that portion of the land of the  
late John Turner lying on the main Road and bounded as follows: South by the main Road  
West by John Moore's Land. North by a line of chopped trees and East by the lands of John  
Boyle the said land by consent of Parties being apportioned to Sally Turner the widow of the  
said John Turner and mother of the aforesaid, Isobell, James and Patience as her third and  
of course is to enjoy the quiet and undisturbed possession of it during her life and the said  
John Boyle in right of Jacob Turner and Gilbert Tynes and Patience his wife doth grant by  
these presents unto Sally Turner that portion of John Turner land called Clayton tract and  
bounded as follows: North by the lands of Mr. Bowring North east by the lands of Bowring  
Road West by the lands of John Bowring and South by John Moore's land and East a  
branch (called Clayton Branch which) divides it from John Boyle's portion of  
John Turner Land to the said James Turner and his heirs forever and the said party  
Turner and Gilbert Tynes and Patience his wife doth grant by these presents unto  
John Boyle that portion of John Turner land called Evans tract and bounded  
as follows: North by the lands of Mr. Bowring and Sam'l A. Holmyard East by the
