Burham & Martha & his wife doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said John Williams One certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton of aforesaid containing by estimation three hundred and eleven and a half acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit on the North by the lands of Edward Ross and on the East by the lands of Howell Scarborough on the South by the lands of Thos Applewhite and on the west by the poplar swamp: To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land and premises with the appurtenances unto the said John Williams his heirs and assigns and also all the right title and interest whatsoever of him the said John L.
