This Indenture made and entered into this 20<sup>th</sup> day of July 1820 between John Turner and  
James Turner Notaway Indians of Southampton County of the one part and James P. French of  
Southampton of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Turner and James Turner for and in  
consideration of the sum of four hundred and seventy five dollars to them in hand paid at  
before the enrolling and delivery of these presents by the said James P. French the receipt whereof  
is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain  
and sell unto the said James P. French his heirs and assigns forever all right title interest claim  
which they or either of them may have in or to the trust property both real and personal now  
held by trustees in Southampton for the benefit of the notaway Indians. The said John  
Turner having selling and conveying the interest which he recovered in a suit or petition in  
the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery in a case styled Good Turner and others  
vs Notaway Trustees decided at the April Term of said Court 1820 and under which decree  
he is entitled to a tract or parcel of land which has not yet been marked out by the  
Surveyor but the boundaries and quantity will appear by reference to the report of the Com-  
missioners filed in accordance with said decree - and the said James Turner having  
selling and conveying his entire interest in this trust estate aforesaid both real and personal  
which he desires and wishes to have allotted and set apart to him for the benefit of the said  
James P. French. The said John Turner and James Turner selling and conveying their  
respective interests to the said James P. French. To have and to hold the said James  
P. French his heirs and assigns forever free from the claim or claims of all persons  
whatsoever. And the said John Turner and James Turner for themselves their heirs &c.  
hath covenanted and agree that they will forever warrant and defend the title hereby  
conveyed to the said James P. French his heirs &c. free from the claim of all persons  
whatsoever. In Testimony whereof they have hereunto set their hands and seals this
