This Indenture made the tenth day of November in the year of our Lord One Thousand eight hundred and forty between Joseph P. Holland of the County of Isle of Wight in the State of Virg^a of the one part and Lemuel C. Roberson of the County of Southampton in the State of Virg^a of the other part: witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid as well as for the consideration of the said debt of four hundred dollars and seventy five cents due the 10th day of November 1839 having been fully paid off and discharge to John M. Holland together with the legal interest thereon accruing, he the said Joseph P. Holland hath granted released and confirmed unto the said Lemuel C. Roberson his heirs executors administrators and assigns two certain negro Slaves namely Boy named Dick and Girl named Matthy as mentioned in the deed of Trust bearing date the 10th day of November 1839 as well by reference to the ^{said} deed of Trust. To have and to hold the said negro slaves together with the future increase of the female afores^d unto the said Lemuel C. Roberson his heirs executors administrators or assigns forever. To and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Lemuel C. Roberson his heirs or assigns forever. And the said Joseph P. Holland for himself and his heirs as treated and as such only doth hereby forever release all right title and claim to the said negro slaves and release and consent firm the title of them to the said Lemuel C. Roberson his heirs and assigns and warrant and defend against the claim or claims demand or demands of him the said Joseph P. Holland his heirs or assigns and of all and every other person or persons claiming by through or under him or them: In witness whereof the said Joseph P.
