This Indenture made this 21st day of November 1840 between John Woodson formerly a member of the Mollwey Tribe of Indians of the one part and James P. French of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John Woodson for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and sixteen dollars, the receipt whereof is here by acknowledged by the said John Woodson as having been paid him by the said James P. French at or before the making and delivery of these presents, he the said John Woodson hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell confirmed and convey to the said James P. French his heirs and assigns forever, all right title interest and claim whatever which he the said John Woodson has in or to the Trust property held by the trustees for the benefit of the Mollwey Indians and which said claim or interest was awarded to the said John Woodson by virtue of a decree of the Sup: Court of Law and Chancery for the County of Southampton in a suit entitled David Turner and others vs Mollwey Indians which said interest is in land and has not yet been otherwise ascertained out by the Surveyor but the said John Woodson hereby conveys to the said J. P. French all right title and interest whatever which vests in him by virtue of said decree free from the claim or claims of all persons whatsoever: Witness my hand and seal this 21st Novr. 1840

Brooks for and in consideration of the sum of Sixteen dollars good and Lawful money of Virginia to her in hand paid by the said Thomas Doyal the receipt whereof the said Mary Ann Brooks doth acknowledge herself amply satisfied and paid hath granted bargained and sold aliened conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Doyal to him and his heirs forever her right in one certain tract of Land and premises situated lying and being back of land formerly known as good land back of land situated lying and being in the County of Southampton bounded as follows joining Thomas Doyal Benjamin Miller Jesse Rly the, Boldy Drake, Child, Jeyner and Mrs. Bawshaw's together with all houses out houses buildings yards gardens
