 bargain and sell unto the aforesaid Thomas H. Drake his heirs and assigns forever all that tract of
 parcels of Land which the said Matthew Drake purchased of Elijah Jernow called the Ober
 tract containing 80 acres more or less which boundaries will more fully appear by reference to the Deed
