This Indenture made and entered into this 25<sup>th</sup> day of December A D 1830 between Gideon R Edwards  
 of the first part William J Gibell and Nicholas M Gibell of the second part and Thomas C Jones of the third part  
 Whereas the said Thomas C Jones and James M Gibell on the day of March in the year 1830 in order to indemnify  
 and secure the said William J & Nicholas M Gibell against all loss and injury as their security to a bond executed to  
 Henry B Vaughan on or about the day of 183 for the sum of fifteen hundred dollars and to four  
 bonds executed to John D Hart bearing date the 19<sup>th</sup> day of December 1830 did by indenture of that date to us  
 the day of March 1830 convey to the said Gideon R Edwards his heirs and assigns the following property  
 to wit Lot No<sup>r</sup> 17 and parts of lots No<sup>r</sup> 18 & 19 situated in the Town of Southampton with the buildings and improvements  
 thereon of every description also a certain piece or parcel of Land and improvements thereon, situated  
 to Lot No<sup>r</sup> 17 and known as the Stable lot supposed to contain about three acres more or less and likewise another  
 piece or parcel of Land lying east of Southampton containing thirty acres more or less upon trust for the  
 uses and purposes in said Indenture mentioned. And whereas the said William J Gibell and Nicholas M Gibell  
 are willing that the property herein after described (being a part of the property conveyed to us aforesaid) shall  
 be released and reconveyed unto the said Thomas C Jones (James M Gibell having by and dated the  
 day of 183 and duly recorded in the Clerks office of Southampton County Court relinquished all  
 his interest in the property aforesaid to the said Thomas C Jones) Now this Indenture witnesseth that in  
 consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand paid  
 by the said Thomas C Jones to the said Gideon R Edwards the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged  
 he the said Gideon R Edwards with the approbation of the said William J Gibell and Nicholas M  
 Gibell declared by their being parties to these presents and the said William J and Nicholas M Gibell  
 have granted bargained and sold aforesaid released and confirmed and by these presents do grant  
 bargained and sold aforesaid release and confirmation unto the said Thomas C Jones all the right title  
 interest claims and demands both at Law and equity which the said Gideon R Edwards William J  
 Gibell and Nicholas M Gibell have or hold in the following property to wit a certain part of a certain  
 house and lot (designated Lot No<sup>r</sup> 17 in the Town of Southampton and County of Southampton) bounded and de-  
 scribed as following beginning on the public square or street directly opposite the centre of the first door of the  
 house known as the Kello house running thence along the public square or street a Northly direction  
 twenty nine feet to the South west corner of a house now occupied by Samuel J Douglass as an office  
 thence in a line by or with the south end of said house or office at right angles an Eastly course to  
 a line between F J Mahone (formerly Gurley) and the premises hereby intended to be released thence  
 along said line a Southly course to a corner between said F J Mahone (formerly Gurley) and the  
 said premises opposite to and within about ten or eleven feet of the centre of the back or rear door of  
 the aforesaid house called the Kello house thence through the centre of the house above and below  
 stairs to the beginning containing by estimation of one acre more or less. Also another lot  
 or piece of Land being apart of the aforesaid Lot No<sup>r</sup> 17 and is the same which was allotted to Edwin  
 Ricks by the Commissioners who made division of Lots No<sup>r</sup> 18 & 19 between Robert Godwin the heir  
 of Henry Gurley and the said Edwin Ricks who is now deceased all of which can be more fully  
 understood by reference to the Commissioners report of said division made in the year 18
