French his heirs &c. and the remainder pay over to the said Samuel Wallace his heirs &c. And we each Command and agree to perform the conditions here entered into. William of James This Indenture made this 23^d day of Decr 1820 between Anthony N. Williams and John A. Turner of the first part Samuel James Douglas of the second part and Saml. T. Jones, Saml. B. Hines, Mrs. Parker Mills James & Louisa Lawrence and James Moore of the third part, Whereas the said Saml. T. Jones, Saml. B. Hines, Mrs. Parker Mills & Lawrence and James Moore have become Secured to the said Anthony N. Williams and John A. Turner in their bonds of one thousand dollars each the first payable on the first day of January 1821 with legal interest from the 20th Decr 1820 The second payable on the first of January 1823 with legal interest thereon from the 20th Decr 1820 The third payable on the first day of January 1824 with legal interest from the 20th Decr 1820 All of which bonds are executed for the sum of one thousand dollars each and given to Thomas L. Jones of the County of Southampton, and the said Anthony N. Williams and John A. Turner are desirous to indemnify and secure the said Saml. T. Jones, Samuel B. Hines, Mrs. Parker Mills & Lawrence and James Moore against all loss and injury from the said Securedship: Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said Saml. James Douglas the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged they the said Anthony N. Williams and John A. Turner do by these presents bargain and sell unto the said Saml. James Douglas his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns the following days to wit: Negro Man Moses and baby Mary and Margaret the property of the said Anthony N. Williams and woman Chury but Martha and boy Phil the property of the said John A. Turner. To have and to hold to him the said Samuel James Douglas his heirs and assigns forever and the said Anthony N. Williams and John A. Turner for themselves their heirs and assigns do Covenant with the said Samuel James Douglas his heirs and assigns that they the said Anthony N. Williams and John A. Turner will their heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said Samuel J. Douglas his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons whatsoever. Upon Trust Nevertheless that the said Samuel James Douglas his heirs and assigns shall permit the said Anthony N. Williams and John A. Turner to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of their respective negroes ^{permanently} hereon before named and to take and enjoy their labor and hire to their own use until default be made in the said sum of money (amounting in all to three thousand dollars and the interest thereon) in whole or in part and thereupon this further trust that the said Samuel James Douglas shall and will so soon the after happen
