Upon Trust Now this day that should the said Samuel Wallace fail to pay the debt herein secured when he shall be required to do so that then the said G R Edwards shall whenever required by the said James G French sell the same at public auction to the highest bidder for cash No<sup>n</sup> Money reasonable notice of such sale having been previously given and out of the proceeds thereof pay the expenses of sale and the debt due G R Edwards his heirs &c and the remainder pay over to the said Samuel Wallace his heirs &c And we each covenant and agree to perform the conditions here inserted into Witness our hands and seals this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of Decr 1840

<sup>Exhibit X</sup> This Indenture made this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of Decr 1840 between Anthony N Williams and John A Turner  
of the first part Samuel James Douglas of the second part and Sam'l J James Sam'l B Hines Mr Parker Miller  
James & Thomas Lawrence and James Moore of the third Whereas the said Sam'l J James Sam'l B Hines Mr Parker Miller &  
Lawrence and James Moore have become security to the said Anthony N Williams and John A Turner in their  
hands of one thousand dollars each the first payable on the first day of January 1840 with legal interest  
from the 20<sup>th</sup> Decr 1840 The second payable on the first day of January 1843 with legal interest thereon from  
the 20<sup>th</sup> Decr 1840 The third payable on the first day of January 1846 with legal interest from the 20<sup>th</sup>  
Decr 1843 All of which bonds are executed for the sum of one thousand dollars each and given to  
Thomas C Jones of the County of Southampton; and the said Anthony N Williams and John A Turner  
are desirous to indemnify and secure the said Sam'l J James Sam'l B Hines Mr Parker Miller &  
Lawrence and James Moore against all loss and injury from the said Securityship: Now this Indenture  
witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of one  
dollar in hand paid by the said Sam'l J James Douglas the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged  
that the said Anthony N Williams and John A Turner do by these presents bargain and sell unto  
the said Sam'l J James Douglas his heirs executors administrators and assigns the following slaves  
to wit: Negro man Moses and his wife Mary and Margaret the property of the said Anthony N  
Williams and woman Chung and Martha and by this the property of the said John A Turner. To have  
and to hold to him the said Sam'l J James Douglas his heirs and assigns forever unto the said Anthony N  
Williams and John A Turner for themselves their heirs and assigns do covenant with the said Sam'l J Douglas  
his heirs and assigns that they the said Anthony N Williams and John A Turner will ~~not~~ bring executors  
and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said Sam'l J Douglas his heirs and assigns  
from any suit or action brought against them for the same or for any damage or injury done to them  
or any of them or for any claim or demand of all persons whatsoever. Upon Trust Now this day that  
the said Sam'l J James Douglas his heirs and assigns shall permit the said Anthony N Williams and  
John A Turner to remain in quiet and peaceful possession of their respective negroes herein before  
named and to take and enjoy their labour and hire to their own use until default be made in the sum  
of money (amounting in all to three thousand dollars and the interest thereon) in whole or in part and  
then upon this further trust that the said Sam'l J Douglas shall and will so soon the after happen-
