This Indenture made and entered into this 26th day of January 1841 between John A. Sumner of the first part Lillston R. Edwardsy of the second part and Mills & Lawrence of the third part. Whereas the said John A. Sumner stands justly indebted unto the said Mills & Lawrence in the sum of Eight hundred dollars by bond bearing even date with these presents and being desirous effectually to secure the payment thereof hath agreed to convey the property hereinafter mentioned unto the said Lillston R. Edwardsy in trust to be sold for that purpose: Now therefore this Indenture Witnesseth that the said John A. Sumner for and in consideration of the premises as well as for the further consideration of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said Lillston R. Edwardsy the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents with good lawfull will and convey unto the said Lillston R. Edwardsy his heirs Executors and assigns the following property to wit: negro boy Boston and five st. household and kitchen furniture plantation namely five horses. also one negro boy Dick his the said Sumner interest in the property held by Mrs. Sarah Sney (wife of John Sney) formerly westbrook in the estate of her former husband David Westbrook dec'd. To have and to hold the said property unto him the said Lillston R. Edwardsy his heirs Executors and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Lillston R. Edwardsy his heirs Executors and assigns forever: Upon the following trust to wit: That if the said John A. Sumner his heirs or assigns shall fail to pay to the said Mills & Lawrence his heirs Executors and assigns the aforesaid sum of money and interest due thereon when the same may be lawfully demanded it shall be the duty of the said Lillston R. Edwardsy
