

Williams & French knew all men by these presents that we John Williams, Puley Williams, and Sally Williams, Members of the Prudence Tribe of Indians of the first part and James P. French of the second part Witnesseth that the said John Williams to whom has been allotted by the Trustees, in fee simple under an order of the County Court of Southampton County, eight and $\frac{1}{4}$ acres of Land known as the Indian plat as N^o 4 in laying off the Indians called the said Sally Williams to whom was the said Order and at the same time there was allotted eighty six and $\frac{1}{4}$ acres known as the plat as N^o 2 and adjoining the piece last described - and the said Puley Williams to whom was allotted eighty six and $\frac{1}{4}$ acres at the same time and under the same order of Court known as the plat as N^o 3 each of these pieces adjoining the lands of Harry Vaughan now foreclosed and being laid off on the Land known as the Indian plat as the Indians called and being allotted to them in lieu of all their interest in the lands above held by the Trustees for the benefit of the Prudence Indians - This Indenture Witnesseth that the said John Williams, Puley Williams, and Sally Williams for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand and eighty three dollars which is four dollars per acre. The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged to wit - the said John Williams the sum of three hundred and seventy four dollars and the said Sally Williams, and Puley Williams the sum of three hundred and forty five dollars, have granted bargained and sold and by these presents the said John Puley and Sally Williams doth grant bargain and sell unto the said James P. French his heirs &c forever all right title interest and claim whatever which they the said John, Puley and Sally Williams such have in and to the Land above them as before described. To have and to hold the said several tracts hereinafter conveyed free from the claims of each one of us and of all other persons whatever.
