French of Southampton for and in consideration of the sum of three thousand four hundred and seventy six dollars the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold unto by these presents doth grant bargain and sell enfeof and convey unto Henry B. Vaughan his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the Indian Woods and containing nine hundred and thirteen acres more or less of an acre and made up of the following tracts or parcels of land purchased by one at different times of the following persons to whom it was allotted to wit John Turner, Jincy Taylor, Mary Williams, John Woodson, Nancy Turner, Patsy Williams, John Williams and James Turner containing three hundred and sixty nine acres known as the Indian field and five hundred acres lying between parallel lines running N 71 W commencing the line nearest the river in the swamp near Peter Turners field and passing through old Edie Turners settlement coming where Williams Turners land was allotted to him the other line bounding it will more fully appear by reference to the survey and 14 3/4 acres bought of S. R. Edwards the said several tracts of Land were purchased by one of the Individuals before referred to the boundaries of which will appear by reference to the several deeds and the reports of the Commr. attesting the same To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with all its appurtenances to the said Henry B. Bride To secure the said Elizabeth Bride To secure the aforesaid for two bonds one her one bearing date January 21st 1840 for \$177 and 35/100 subject to a credit of \$25. 25/100 February 15th 1841 the other bond on demand the 20th December 1840 for \$110 dollars subject to a credit of \$25. 25/100 January 21st 1840 these bonds are payable to Elizabeth Bride the said Miss A. Bride is desirous to secure. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar lawful money in hand paid to the said Miss A. Bride by the said Jonathan Darden the trustee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged in the said Miss A. Bride hath given granted bargained sold aliened enfeofed released and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien enfeof release and confirm to the said Jonathan Darden his heirs and assigns forever the following personal property to wit three further bedsteads and furniture one mahogany bureau one brass bedstead clock one shot gun four tables and oil cloth six window chairs four flag bottom two small ditto one looking glass one red. Christ one large trunk one pair flat Irons one pair fire dogs three warts one hatchet one spider one pan one skillet one Tazong potter shovel and long three tubs one can and one mopper all of my tin ware all of the cooking ware all of the glass ware one cornu cupboard full of the knives and forks one grid Iron three pots one set of large pewee spoons one set small ditto her pot racks three stone jars one bridle one spinning wheel
