forty one between William Howell of the first part John Cobb of the second part and Randolph Fowler
of the third part all of the County of Hampshire and State of Virginia: Witnesseth that the said William
Howell hath for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the
said Randolph Fowler the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged bargained and sold and sold
by these presents bargain and sell alienate and confirm unto the said Randolph Fowler his heirs
and assigns forever the following property: (Viz) One horse one Cart and wheels two feather beds
and furniture one pine table three chairs one chest one Trunk one press one saw all my
of iron fiddles and lever off and all his household and kitchen furniture farming Utensils
I have and to hold upon the following trust (Viz) The same William Howell stands justly indebted
to the said John Cobb in the sum of Forty dollars which appears by note bearing date with these
presents and on demand. The William Howell being desirous to indemnify and secure the pay-
ment of the aforesaid debt on or before the 11th of next June: Witnesseth that if the said William
Howell shall fail to pay the aforesaid debt with interest and all costs pertaining to this In-
denture on or before the 11th of next June. it shall then be lawful and right for the said
Randolph Fowler or so good as requested by the said John Cobb in writing to expose at public
auction the aforesaid property for cash after having given ten days notice and settle the aforesaid
debt with all costs pertaining to this Indenture and the overplus if any pay over to the said William
Howell or order: One Witness whereof we the parties have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals
this day and year as is above written

use of the Commonwealth for the payment whereof well and truly to be made we bind ourselves our
heirs Executors and administrators jointly and severally jointly by these presents sealed with our
seals and dated this 15th day of March 1841

The conditions of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound Samuel J. James
has been appointed by the Court of Southampton County to serve as Constable within the same under
and David 1422. Now if the said Samuel J. James shall well and truly discharge the duties of the
Office of Constable in the said County during his continuance therein then the above obligation to be
void or else to remain in full force and Virtue.
