W. Stephenson John Lutes in hand paid by the said Wm G Stephenson at and before the executing and delivery of
these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said John Lutes hath given granted
bargained sold aliened enfeoffed released and Confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargains
sell alien enfeoff release and Confirm to the said Wm G Stephenson their heirs and assigns forever
the feather beds and furniture One chest or trunk two Tables one Cupboard six chairs twelve
earthen plates One set Cups and Saucers two Food pots one round one Spider 1 Skillet 1 Axe 1 wooding hoe
one Hatchet and Carpenters Tools and One Bushel To have and to hold the said property unto the said
Wm G Stephenson his heirs and assigns forever Upon trust moreover that the said William G
Stephenson shall permit the said John Lutes to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the above
named property and take the profits till default be made in the payment of the above named
sum of forty dollars and the interest accruing thereon and upon the further trust that the said Wm
G Stephenson shall and will so soon after the happening of such default or be requested by the said
Willard Stephenson sell to the highest bidder the property herein conveyed after giving ten days
notice of the time and place of Sale then proceed to sell the same and out of the money arising
from such sale first pay all necessary expences attending the sale and then pay to the said Willard
Stephenson the debt aforesaid with legal interest thereon and the balance if any he shall
