This Indenture made and entered into this 20th day of June 1840 between Hanning J. Smith of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Richard H. Beamon of said County and State of the other part witnesseth that the said H. J. Smith for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said R. H. Beamon at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto him the said R. H. Beamon his heirs and assigns forever a tract piece or parcel of Land lying and being in the aforesaid County and State containing by estimation One hundred acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a cypress immediately on the margin of the black water River from thence down said River two hundred and eighty yards to and ash also on the margin of said River and on the State line or the line dividing the State of Virginia and North Carolina thence along said State line to the Roanoke River supposed to be about One mile to a willow on said State line and immediately on the margin of the Roanoke River thence up said Roanoke River two hundred and eighty yards to a cypress on the margin of said Roanoke River thence parallel with the said State line to the first station together with all its appurtenances. To have and to hold said land and premises unto him the said R. H. Beamon his heirs and assigns forever. And the said H. J. Smith for himself and heirs do warrant the right and title to the said R. H. Beamon against the claims or demands of himself and heirs forever. In witness whereof the said H. J. Smith have hereunto set his hand and seal this day and date above written -

This Indenture made the 13th day of January 1841 between Edwin Harrison and his wife of the one part and Edwin Daughtry of the other part witnesseth that the said Edwin Harrison and his wife Mary Harrison in consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand to him paid by the said E. Daughtry at or before the making and delivery of these presents have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto said Edwin Daughtry his heirs and assigns all my right and title to a certain tract or parcel of Land containing by estimation four hundred acres be the same more or less (known by the name of Sandy plantation) lying on the North side of Roanoke River Hampton City Va. and bounded as follows to wit on the East by the Cypress Swamp North by Elisha Jordan and the land belonging to the estate of Harwood Parker Northwest and West by said Parker's land L. B. Daughtry and the land belonging to the estate of Britton Price Jr. and Co East by Maloy & Patmon's land and the land of H. J. Smith together with all the buildings Timber and other appurtenances whatsoever to the said Edwin Daughtry. To have and to hold the said tract of land with all the appurtenances before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof to the said Edwin Daughtry his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Edwin Daughtry his heirs and assigns forever The above named tract or parcel of land with all its appurtenances is this day
