This Indenture made the 13th day of April in the year of our said Christ one thousand
 eight hundred and forty one between Jeremiah Stephenson of the first part George M Spicy of the
 second part and Nathaniel Luter of the third part, whereas the said Jeremiah Stephenson is justly
 indebted to the said Nathaniel Luter in the sum of forty two and fifty seven cents as by some
 due bearing date with these presents which debt and legal interest thereof the said Jeremiah
 Stephenson is willing and desirous to secure: Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and
 in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of one dollar to the
 said Jeremiah Stephenson in hand paid by the said George M Spicy at and before the making
 and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Jeremiah
 Stephenson hath given granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed released and confirmed
 and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien enfeoff and confirm to the said
 George M Spicy there heirs and assigns forever the following property one bay boat one
 work steer and cow and quarter four sheep and five barrels of corn. To have and to
 hold the said property above named unto the said George M Spicy his heirs and assigns
 forever upon trust notwithstanding that the said George M Spicy shall as soon as requested
 in the payment of the above named sum of forty two dollars and fifty seven cents
 be made or as soon as he may be requested by the said Nathaniel Luter and giving two
 days notice of the time and place of the sale of the said property by three several
 advertisements to be posted up at the most public places in the neighborhood that
 proceed to sell the same to the highest bidder for cash and out of the money
 from such sale first pay all necessary expenses attending the sale and then pay
 to the said Nathaniel Luter the debt aforesaid with legal interest thereon and the
 balance if any he shall pay to the said Jeremiah Stephenson his heirs assigns
 and demands. And testimony whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their
