of the one part and Norfolk B. Butler of the aforesaid County of the other part. Witnesseth that for and
in Consideration of the rents Covenants and agreements herein after reserved and contained and what
by and in the part of the said Norfolk B. Butler his heirs executors and administrators to be paid done
and performed by the said Benjamin Phillips hath leased demised granted and to forward to
and by these presents doth grant and to forward to unto the said Norfolk B. Butler his heirs executors
and administrators all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton and state
of Virginia known and called by the name of the Buckhorn tract and bounded by the lands of the
S. Brule Benjamin Phillips and the hedges of Lafayette Bowood. To have and to hold the said
tract or parcel of land unto the said Norfolk B. Butler his heirs executors and administrators from the
first day of January next ensuing the date hereof for and during and unto the full end and
term of two years from thence next ensuing and fully to be completed undivided goddning and paying
therefor yearly and every year during the said term unto the said Benjamin Phillips the yearly rent of
