This Indenture made this day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty one between James M. Pond acting as trustee of the one part and William D. Wood of the other part and both of the County of Southampton. Witnesseth that for and in consideration of two hundred and fifty dollars current money of Virginia to him the said James M. Pond in hand paid or about to be paid at or before the making and delivery of these presents by the said William D. Wood the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged has bargained and sold and by these presents does bargain and sell unto the said William D. Wood his heirs and assigns forever that tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging lying in the County of Southampton conveyed by deed of gift by Patrick Pond and Polly his wife to Samuel M. Pond dated the 16th of October 1829 and of Record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton and conveyed by the said Samuel M. Pond by deed of trust to the said James M. Pond for the benefit of William D. Wood his security to a debt due Benjamin J. Drew as well as to secure a debt due the estate of Benjamin M. Hancock containing 321 acre more or less and bounded as follows beginning at a sweet gum at the corner of William D. Wood's fence on the South side of the hunting road thence nearly East to a Red Oak near the bend of said Road thence nearly North to a pine in the head of the pond branch thence down the various courses of the said branch to the Savin or water branch to a marked pine thence down the said branch to the river branch to a marked black gum in the mouth of Hunting branch thence up said branch to Richard B. Kellum (now a marked pine) thence along said line to Grand Springs line (formerly Shirley line) thence along said line to the line separating this tract from the husband's tract thence along said line to Robert Gentry line thence along Robert Gentry line to a branch separating this tract from Woods tract thence along said branch to the beginning with the yearly and other marks of
