This Indenture made and entered into this 21st day of June in the year 1841 between Edward
Butts acting trustee for Rebecca J. Coville and her children who was appointed by the County Court of
Southampton to supply the place of James Rochelle dec'd the former trustee of the County of South-
ampton and State of Virginia of the One part and Joseph J. Bland of the same County and State
of the other part (Witnesses) That the said Edward Butts trustee as aforesaid being instructed by
the said Rebecca J. Coville by written request which right is guaranteed to her in a marriage contract
between her husband Mr. J. Coville and herself and duly recorded in the Clerk's office of Southampton County
that she may by written request authorize the trustee to dispose of any property to her belonging and
purchase any property from the proceeds of such sale or apply the money arising in any way she may
by virtue of which the said Edward Butts trustee as aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of
One hundred and twenty five dollars to the said Rebecca J. Coville in hand paid by the said J. J. Bland
for the use and benefit of her the said Rebecca J. Coville and children at and before the executing and
delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged as will more fully appear by her
receipt attached to this deed the said Edward Butts trustee as aforesaid hath this day given granted
bargain sold and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell and confirm unto
the said Joseph J. Bland his heirs and assigns forever all the right title and interest the said
Rebecca J. Coville is entitled to in a certain well sit together with the land and improvements
thereunto attached and all privileges thereunto belonging formerly known by the name and called
Blunts the well situated on the flat swamp in the County of Southampton her interest being
One fourth part of the half formerly owned by her father Allen Jones dec'd as will more fully
