This Indenture made and executed this 19th day of July A.D. One thousand eight hundred and forty one. Witness that the said Harrison Marney and Marney his wife stands justly indebted to the said Anthony Vaughan in the sum of two hundred and twenty five dollars which appears by note bearing date with these presents and the said Harrison Marney and Marney his wife being desirous to secure the payment of the aforesaid debt and all costs pertaining thereto and but more especially for the sum of One dollar to them in hand paid by the said Matthew W. Vaughan the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and do by these presents bargain and sell alienate and confirm unto the said Matthew W. Vaughan his heirs assigns and assigns forever. The following property (Viz) One tract of land containing sixty two and a half acres it being the tract of land the said Harrison Marney purchased of the said Anthony Vaughan One parcel more or less and whole two feather beds and furniture and that part twelve head of hogs two sitting chairs One Apple Mill Two pots One Spider One Oven and one forging press Upon the following ^{by delivery} condition and trust to wit if the said Harrison Marney shall fail to pay the aforesaid debt with all costs pertaining thereto when ever required by the said Anthony Vaughan it shall then lawful and right for the said Matthew W. Vaughan as soon as requested by the said Anthony Vaughan his heirs assigns or assigns after giving ten days notice of the time and place of sale at least three public places in the neighborhood to sell the aforesaid property for cash and out of the proceeds of such sale first pay all costs pertaining to this and then pay unto the said Anthony Vaughan his heirs assigns and assigns the amount of the aforesaid debt and the surplus if any pay over to the aforesaid Harrison Marney and Marney his wife or order and to convey unto the purchaser or purchasers a good and sufficient title and right to the aforesaid property and every part and parcel thereof.
