This indenture made and entered into on this 15<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred  
and forty one between Lydia Dick (widow of James Dick) & Jacob Porter and Elizabeth his wife Lydia Dick  
William Dick and Maria Dick his wife all of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia &  
the one part and Josiah Dick of the same County and state of the other part. Witnesseth that the said  
Lydia Dick gave Porter and Elizabeth his wife James Dick William Dick before Dick his widow  
his wife for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars to them in hand  
paid by the said Josiah Dick at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof  
is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain  
and sell unto the said Josiah Dick his heirs and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of  
land and premises situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish  
of Saint Luke containing by a late survey thirty three and one fourth acres (be it more  
or less) to bring lot #15 drawn by said Josiah Dick in the division of the two tracts  
of land of James Dick - acre (exclusive of the widow's dower land) as divided by Jacob Burns  
Esq; John Ellsworth and Benjamin Burns Gentlemen appointed by the heirs of James Dick  
to lay off the widow's dower in said two tracts of land and to divide the balance into four  
parts or lots equal in valuation. And bounded as follows to wit beginning at a pine standing in  
John B. Turner's lot a corner for lot #15 drawn by Jacob Porter in right of his wife Eliza  
and thence along said Turner's line 937<sup>1/2</sup> ft 8 1/2 pole to a maple thence 183<sup>1/2</sup> ft 8 1/2 pole  
to a pine thence 177<sup>1/2</sup> ft 6 1/2 pole to a post oak thence 181<sup>1/2</sup> ft 6 1/2 pole to a corner thence 323<sup>1/2</sup> ft 6 1/2  
pole to a pine thence 933 ft 6 1/2 pole to a large pine a corner for said John B. Turner in lot #15

Richard Jackson's estate and said Elizabeth Porter thence her line along the center of a  
ditch 93<sup>1/2</sup> ft 11 1/2 pole to a pine thence 941<sup>1/2</sup> ft 11 1/2 pole to a pine thence 93<sup>1/2</sup> ft 11 1/2 pole
