One hundred and fifty dollars to them in hand paid by the said John Dick at or before the sealing  
and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained  
and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto him the said John Dick his heirs  
and assigns forever One certain tract or parcel of land and premises situated lying and being  
in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Saint Luke containing by a late survey  
Seventeen and One fourth acres (be the same more or less) it being lot No 1 drawn by said John  
Dick in the division of the two tracts of land of James Dick son & heir of the aforesaid
