This Indenture made this 28th day of July 1841 between Edward Drake and Sally his wife of the
first part Gilbert Wick trustee of the second part and John Wick and Amos J. Drury of the third
part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia witnesses that the said Edward Drake
and Sally his wife for and in consideration of the sum of two dollars to them in hand paid by the said
Gilbert Wick at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby
acknowledged as well as the further considerations of the said Edward Drake and Sally his wife
being justly indebted to the said Wick and Drury in the just and full sum of one hundred
and thirty seven dollars and 66^{cts} due by bona bearing note with these obligations the said Edward
Drake and Sally his wife is willing to secure the said Wick and Drury which is the sole object of
these presents hath granted bargained sold and conveyed unto the said Gilbert Wick his
heirs executors or assigns one certain tract of land lying and being in the County aforesaid
containing one hundred and eleven acres be the same more or less and bounded as
follows (to wit) by the land of Cornish Cobb on the South on the west and North by
the land of Capt. Butts on the East by the land formerly belonging to the heirs of
Joseph Drury dec. of which this is a part. I also convey all my growing crops of all the
household stuff and I convey unto the said Gilbert Wick his heirs executors or
assigns forever but upon this special trust and condition that the said Gilbert Wick
his heirs or assigns upon being requested by John Wick and Amos J. Drury their heirs
or assigns shall make sale of the above mentioned land and other property at public sale
the best price that can be obtained any time after the first of August 1842 after advertising
ten days previous to the day of sale at all of the most public places in the neighborhood
herein as the said Gilbert Wick may think fit and with the money arising from the
sale first pay Wick and Drury their debt and all cost which may accrue in making
sale of the above mentioned property and then pay the over plus if any to the said Edward
Drake and Sally his wife and the said Edward Drake and Sally his wife for themselves
their heirs and assigns do warrant the right and title of the aforesaid land and other
