 and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to him paid before the sealing and delivery of these
 presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said William Pritchard hath granted bargained
 and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said John O. Murson all that parcel of
 Land situate in the County of Southampton containing One hundred and seventy two acres siting the
 share which in the division of the lands of said Pritchard was allotted to the said Wm Pritchard
 the M^{rs} and heirs of which parcel of Land will more fully appear by reference to the report of A.
 P. Pate Henry B. Vaughan and David Hurris Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Southampton
 to make division of said decedent's land and by a plat and survey made by John M. Watkins according
 to said Commissioners report. Now of Record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County Court.
 To have and to hold the said parcel of Land with all and singular its appurtenances to him the said
 John O. Murson and to his heirs and the said William Pritchard (consent with the said John O.
 Murson and his heirs) That he shall have and enjoy a good title to the said tract of Land and

 of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said Orrin Vaughan and Mary his
 wife have for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and seventy five dollars to them in hand by the
 said Simon Murson the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged bargained and sold and do by these presents
 bargain and sell enfeof and confirm unto the said Simon Murson his heirs and assigns forever one certain
 tract and parcel of land containing One hundred and eighty two ^{to the} acres or less and bounded as follows
 Viz beginning at a black gum a corner of this tract and thence North 66° 50' 12" E 102 ft to a pine stump
 then N 75° 53' 0" E to a large white gum then N 66° 50' 12" E to an old stump then N 72° 5' 12" E to a pine stump
 East 7 ft to another pine corner between David Cobb and Victor Eley then N 82° 5' 12" E to a cut gum then
 N 74° 5' 12" E to a cut gum corner of this tract and Victor Eley in the latter tract then N 53° 12' 24" E along the road
 to a small pine stump then N 31° 12' 30" E to a Red oak then N 30° 12' 30" E to a post at a pine stump then N 16° 12' 30" E
 to another post at another pine stump then East 3 ft 12 links to a small pine then N 57° 5' 12" E to a pine then N 40°
 5' 12" E to a white oak then S 30° 12' 30" E to a Red oak a side line then N 36° 12' 30" E to an old oak stump then
 N 24° 12' 30" E to a pine then N 60° 5' 12" E to a pine then N 77° 5' 12" E to a small black gum then N 75° 5' 12" E
